PG&E: Potential PSPS to Impact 1,300 Central Coast Customers

Soledad, Calif – Approximately 1,300 PG&E customers in Monterey and San Benito Counties may be impacted by a potential Public Safety Power Shutoff on Friday and Saturday. PG&E's in-house meteorologist are monitoring a dangerous pulse of windy, dry and hot weather forecasted to enter the southern part of PG&E's service area Friday morning. This weather event has prompted the National Weather Service for San Francisco Bay/Monterey to issue a Red Flag Warning. Proactively turning off the power for safety to reduce wildfire risk is a last resort option for PG&E. We'll share how we're supporting customers during this extraordinary heat wave.
