Barb McGaughey, President of the Central Coast YMCA addressed the City Council and stated she wanted to thank City Manager Gonzalez and Public Works Director Wilcox for a positive and productive experience in coming up with the new agreement. She also stated it was the best outcome for both parties.

Joe Gonzalez, Director of the South County YMCA addressed the City Council and thanked the City Council, City Manager Gonzalez and Public Works Director Wilcox for all of their work in putting the YMCA agreement together. He commended the City for hiring Consultant Barry Weiss who he felt was a good asset to the meetings.

Jonathan Bañuelos, Soledad Resident addressed the City Council and informed them that he was part of the Bomberz Softball Team. He stated he had applied for a Firework Sales Permit but his application was incomplete due to not being non-profit status. He said he had applied for the non-profit status and had a confirming letter to show as proof. He would like the City Council to consider approving his application.

City Attorney Rodriguez addressed the City Council and informed them that since the item arose after the agenda was posted, the Council could take action and add the item to the agenda for discussion. He also suggested that the City Council could approve the permit with the condition that it meets all requirements, which would be verified by staff.

Mayor Ledesma reported that he will be attending a Governing For Racial Equity (GRE) conference in Seattle, WA, on June 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup>.

### **COUNCILMEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS AND REPORTS**

Announcements and Reports on meetings attended by Councilmembers at City of Soledad expense as required by State law (AB1234).

Councilmember Perez stated he attended the Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority meeting where it was stated that the South County Cities were paying for the City of Salinas's green waste. He informed the Council that the City of Salinas has been given a 6-month notice that they will be paying the full amount for their green waste diversion.

Mayor Pro Tem Chavez reported that on May 27<sup>th</sup> he attended the TAMC meeting and the main discussion was about the budget. He stated that TAMC had approved their budget for FY 15-16. He also reported that he attended the TAMC Executive Committee meeting where they discussed possibly having a transportation tax increase of 3/8 of a cent. He said he was unable to attend the Rail Policy Meeting due to a scheduling conflict.

Councilmember Bourke reported he had attended the AMBAG meeting on May 13<sup>th</sup>. He informed the Council that the major point of discussion was that they would be building a major Multi-Modal Corridor with bike lanes.

Councilmember Stephens reported that she will be attending a Policy Committee meeting June 12<sup>th</sup> in Sacramento. She also reported that she will attend a ribbon cutting ceremony with the MST Board for their first electric trolley. She said the ribbon cutting would be Monday, June 8<sup>th</sup> in Pacific Grove at 11:30 a.m.

Public Works Director Wilcox presented the staff report to the City Council. He stated there were three main highlights he would like to point out. 1) The City of Soledad logo will appear on their website. 2) A flat amount of \$142,800 was negotiated 3) The City will receive a reporting on measureable outcomes.

Finance Director Howard addressed the City Council and presented the staff report. He informed the City Council that the General Fund revenues are expected to be \$6.6 million and the budget expenditures show \$6.5 million, leaving only \$100,000 for the reserves. He stated that at the end of Fiscal Year 2015-2016, the General Fund reserve is projected to be approximately \$1,000,000. He stated that the Successor Agency budget was also being presented.

**Council Discussion:**

Mayor Pro Tem/Vice Chair Chavez commented that the budget looked good. He said it was a great accomplishment to get the reserves to \$1 million. He stated that the work being done by everyone is commendable.

City Manager/Executive Director Gonzalez informed the City Council that this year, Staff had not used the Budget Committee because there was no surplus or major changes. She mentioned that Measure Y Oversight Committee had provided their recommendations to the City Council earlier in the year.

**B-4.** Discussion Concerning Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Cultivation, and Direction to Staff

City Manager Gonzalez presented the staff report to the City Council. She informed the City Council that back in 2010 the City adopted an Emergency Ordinance to ban dispensaries but the Ordinance was only effective for one year.

City Attorney Rodriquez stated that there have been some instances where folks have approached the City and inquired about the City's position on Medical Marijuana. He stated that in 2016 there is a chance it may be legalized.

**Council Discussion:** Mayor Pro Tem Chavez stated he would like to hear from the Police Chief.

Police Chief Sills stated he had attended a presentation in Riverside and seems it has been a huge problem for them. He stated that although there is a revenue side to it, it's not enough to cover the cost of having to monitor it.

Councilmember Bourke stated he heard the dispensaries are having a hard time putting their money into banks.

City Attorney Rodriquez informed the Council that they should keep in mind that a moratorium has an expiration.

Mayor Ledesma stated he sees the good but he also sees the bad side. He is leaning more towards Chief Sills view. He fears that monitoring it will become an issue.

Councilmember Bourke stated he would like to see a similar ordinance to the one adopted earlier come back before the City Council. He stated he is not in favor of Medical Marijuana. He stated that if in 2016 it becomes legal then it could be brought back for discussion. He also feels it will be much more trouble than it's worth.

Mayor Pro Tem Chavez stated he would like to see something brought before the City Council that would ban medical marijuana dispensaries. He feels that at this point the City of Soledad does not have the resources such as police, to monitor it.

Councilmember Perez stated he agrees with Mayor Pro Tem Chavez's request and statement. He too is against medical marijuana dispensaries and cultivation in the City limits.

Councilmember Stephens she mirrors her fellow Council Member's thoughts. She too is not in favor of medical marijuana dispensaries or cultivation in the City.

City Manager Gonzalez stated that staff would come back with an Ordinance for approval at the July meeting.

City Attorney Rodriguez informed the City Council that the Ordinance was patterned around other ordinances that have been adopted. He stated that this ordinance only covered those drugs adopted by the State.

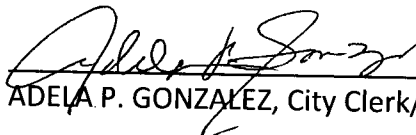
