

RESOLUTION NO 2453**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOLEDAD
AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN
AGREEMENT WITH MONTEREY COUNTY FOR THE
GRANT ALLOCATION OF PROPOSITION 172
FUNDS FOR 911 EMERGENCY
SERVICES FEES**

WHEREAS, the Local Public Safety Protection and Improvement Act of 1993 was approved as Proposition 172 by the voters at the statewide general election conducted on November 2, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the State has allocated to the County and the Cities a portion of the revenues derived from the sales and use tax enacted pursuant to Proposition 172; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County has determined that it is in the best public interests of all of the residents of Monterey County for the County to allocate to the cities a portion of the County's share of funds received from the State pursuant to Proposition 172; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the cities that Proposition 172 funds received from the County shall be used solely for the provision of Police and Fire services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council of the City of Soledad approves the grant allocation hereunto attached, marked "Exhibit A" and by reference made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to sign and transmit the attached document to the Monterey County Board of Supervisors.

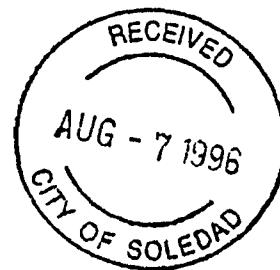

E. The Board of Supervisors of the County has determined that it is in the best public interests of all of the residents of Monterey County for the County to allocate to the Cities a portion of the County's share of funds received from the State pursuant to Proposition 172, and

F It is the intent of the Cities that Proposition 172 funds received by the Cities pursuant to this Grant shall be used for provision of fire and police services; and

G. It is the intent of the Parties as of this date that this Grant shall remain in effect until or unless Proposition 172 has been rescinded. The Parties further acknowledge that this Grant is not binding on future Boards of Supervisors of the County or future City Councils of the Cities.

GRANT TERMS

1.0 Grant of Proposition 172 Funds to the Cities. For the fiscal year commencing July 1, 1995, the County allocates nine percent (9%) of the actual funds received by the County from the State pursuant to Proposition 172 to pay, for and on behalf of the Cities, the Cities' share of the costs of the 911 emergency communication system in Monterey County. Commencing on July 1, 1996, the County allocates ten percent (10%) of the actual funds received by the County from the State pursuant to Proposition 172 to pay, for and on behalf of the Cities' share of the costs of the 911 emergency communication system in Monterey County.

2.0 Conditions to Grant. The Cities agree, individually and collectively, that:

2.1 The Cities shall promptly pay to the County upon demand any and all costs of the 911 emergency communication system in Monterey County which exceed the allocation of Proposition 172 funds set forth above and shall determine among themselves the proportion of such excess costs to be paid by each of the Cities.

2.2 The Cities shall use the local monies made available as a result of the County's allocation of Proposition 172 funds only and exclusively for public safety purposes as required by Proposition 172 and its implementing legislation. Nothing in this Grant shall require any City from securing any prior approval of the County before any expenditure for a public purpose may be made. In the event that any City uses some or all of such monies for purposes other than
