

RESOLUTION NO. 5261

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOLEDAD
DECLARING THE CANVASS OF RETURNS AND RESULTS OF THE
CONSOLIDATED GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION
HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2016**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Soledad adopted Resolution No. 5212 on August 3, 2016, calling for a Consolidated General Municipal Election to be held in the City on November 8, 2016, entailing both a vote for the position of mayor and two councilmember positions and to consider an increase to the City's Transient Occupancy Tax, as set forth in Section 3.16.020 of the Soledad Municipal Code, from nine percent (9%) to twelve percent (12%); and

WHEREAS, said Consolidated General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 8, 2016, in accordance with law, and the votes cast were received, canvassed, and the returns ascertained, determined and declared in all respects as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Certificate of Registrar of Voters, and the attached record of votes cast at the election, was provided to the City Clerk on December 7, 2016, and is attached hereto as Attachment A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Soledad that:

1. Measure F, the ballot measure that appeared and was printed upon the ballots used in said election, as well as the election results, are as follows:

Measure F "Shall Section 3.16.020 of Chapter 3.16 of the Soledad Municipal Code be amended to increase the existing transient occupancy tax, charged only to occupants of city hotels, from nine percent (9%) to twelve percent (12%), increasing the tax collected to an estimated \$20,000 for a new estimated annual total of \$100,000, with no termination date, to continue to provide funding for essential services such as police, fire, street repair, park maintenance and community programs?"

2. Measure F received 2,226 yes votes, or 61.44% of votes cast, and as such, Ordinance No. 701, which serves to amend the Soledad Municipal Code to effectuate the above referenced change in the transient occupancy tax, was adopted by the voters with an effective date of December 18, 2016.

3. The list of candidates nominated for the office of Mayor to be filled at said Consolidated General Municipal Election, and the names of the candidates which were set forth in the petitions as required by law, and the number of votes cast in favor of each of the candidates, are as follows:

4. Fred J. Ledesma was thereby elected Mayor for the term of two (2) years.
5. The list of candidates nominated for the office of Councilmember to be filled at said Consolidated General Municipal Election, and the names of the candidates which were set forth in the petitions as required by law, and the number of votes cast in favor of each of the candidates are as follows:

6. Anna M. Velazquez and Carla Stewart received the highest number of votes cast for the office of Council Member and were thereby elected Council Members, each for the full term of four (4) years.
7. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to sign and deliver thereto a Certificate of Election and to administer the Oath of Office, unless otherwise given by another qualified administrator, prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California.
8. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to enter this Resolution in the official records of the City as a statement of the results of said Consolidated General Municipal Election.


